Priority is as follows: entities that directly serves or consistently encounters people who use/have used drugs aka “essential” (peer support programs, homeless service organizations, etc.) “high need” entities (public health agencies, schools, and correctional facilities), “medium need” (libraries, local governments, churches, etc.) Final priority is everyone else.
